| | Phase one of the off-street parking review and the introduction of an off-street parking strategy seeks to explore the tariff structures of all town centre parking places which fall within the Crawley Borough Council Off-Street Parking Places Order. The applicable sites within the remit of phase one are the Town Hall Multi-Storey Car Park, Orchard Street Multi-Storey Car Park, Kingsgate Multi-Storey Car Park, and Orchard Street Surface Car Park. The scope of the phase one review is to understand more fully | |

the role of our Town Centre Parking Places which include income generation which supports wider delivery of the council's functions and supporting the economic vitality of the town centre. The overarching principle of phase one is to explore the sites individually, assessing what
