6 **Solar Together Sussex**

Crawley is working in partnership with the County Council and other partner authorities in Sussex to help residents install solar panels and reduce their carbon emissions.

Sussex homeowners, organisations and small and medium sized enterprises will be able to register to take part in the [Solar Together Sussex](#) scheme which we are running in conjunction with iChoosr, who are experts in running group buying schemes.

By [registering](#) before the 6 October 2020, residents can get a free, no obligation offer setting out the cost of installing solar panels on their home and the likely return on investment.

The solar panels will be installed by an accredited contractor to established quality standards and at a reduced cost because of the volume of installations being carried out across Sussex.

The Solar Together Sussex scheme is being run on a zero-cost basis with commission payments from the installations covering direct marketing costs.
