PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS:-

The determining issues in this application are the effect of the proposal on the health, character and appearance of the tree and the level of amenity that it provides within the surrounding area.

The tree is located to the front of numbers 51 to 53 Worth Road. The works are part of a Borough wide survey of CBC owned trees to identify and undertake safety and general maintenance works, particularly to those within falling distance of houses and public spaces.

The tree requires containment/maintenance pruning due to its proximity to the highway, the works will have a negligible impact on tree health and amenity and are therefore considered justified.

The small Holly and Yew growing around the base of the tree require removal in order to allow a detailed inspection of the base, these smaller trees are of relatively low quality and are not protected and it is considered there is no objection to their removal.

RECOMMENDATION RE: CR/2019/0907/TPO

CONSENT - Subject to the following condition(s):-

1. This consent is valid for a period of two years from the date of this notice and shall only be carried out once.
REASON: To enable the Local Planning Authority to control the works in the interests of good tree management in accordance with Regulation 17 of the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation) (England) Regulations 2012.
2. All works should be carried out in accordance with BS3998: 2010 'Tree Work Recommendations'.
REASON: In the interests of visual amenity and to ensure the continuing health of the tree(s) in accordance with The Town & Country Planning (Tree Preservation) (England) Regulations 2012.

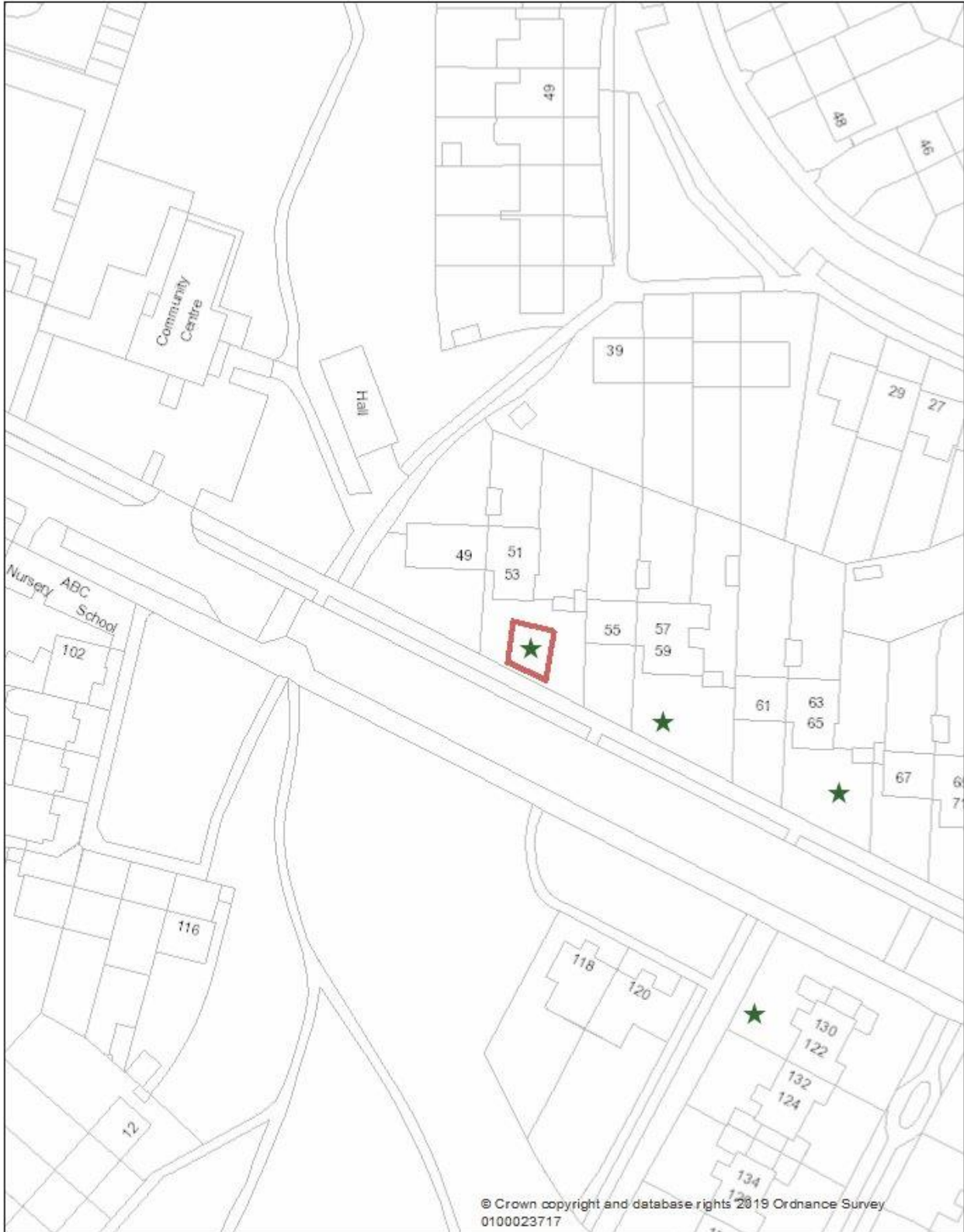
